2. Debtor’s Application for Entry of an Order Pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 156(c) Approving the Retention and Appointment of Epiq Bankruptcy Solutions, LLC as the Claims and Noticing Agent to the Debtors, Effective *Nunc Pro Tunc* to the Petition Date [Docket No. 4 - filed January 13, 2017].
