**ORDER DENYING CONDITIONAL MOTION TO ESTABLISH A TWO-STEP  
PROTOCOL FOR ESTIMATING THE DEBTOR'S ASBESTOS LIABILITIES**

This matter coming before the Court on the *Official Committee of Asbestos Personal Injury Claimants' and the Future Claimants' Representative's Conditional Motion to Establish a Two-Step Protocol for Estimating the Debtor's Asbestos Liabilities* [Dkt. 1031] (the "Motion"),<sup>2</sup> filed by Official Committee of Asbestos Personal Injury Claimants and the Future Claimants' Representative (together, the "Claimant Representatives"); DBMP LLC, the debtor and

debtor in possession in the above-captioned chapter 11 case (the “Debtor”), having filed an objection to the Motion [Dkt. 1076] (the “Objection”); the Claimant Representatives having filed a reply in further support of the Motion [Dkt. 1089] (the “Reply”); the Court having reviewed the Motion, the Objection and the Reply and having heard the statements of counsel with respect to the Motion at a hearing before the Court on October 4, 2021 (the “Hearing”); and the Court having announced its ruling on the Motion at a hearing on October 14, 2021 (the “Oral Ruling”);

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

1. For the reasons set forth in the Oral Ruling (which is incorporated herein), the Motion is DENIED.
2. This Court shall retain exclusive jurisdiction over any and all matters arising from or related to the implementation, interpretation or enforcement of this Order.
