**FIRST REPORT OF
JOSEPH J. TOMAINO
AS PATIENT CARE OMBUDSMAN**

I, Joseph J. Tomaino, the duly appointed Patient Care Ombudsman (“PCO”) appointed by the United States Trustee pursuant to an order of the Court entered in the above-captioned bankruptcy cases, file this first report pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 333 (b)(2). This case involves Delphi Behavioral Health Group, LLC, et. Al. (“Delphi”) a provider of residential and outpatient services for persons with substance use disorder in multiple states. Delphi filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy on February 6, 2023 (Doc. 1)

On February 17, 2023, the Bankruptcy Court entered an order directing the appointment of a Health Care Ombudsman (Doc. 105). On the same date, the United States Trustee appointed Joseph Tomaino to serve as Patient Care Ombudsman (Doc. 107, 108).

On April 3, 2023, a notice of the first patient care ombudsman report was filed (Doc. 334).

Approach

On February 23, 2023, the PCO had an introductory call with debtor and debtor's counsel. During this call, he reviewed the PCO role and established which sites remained in operation, and how the sites which were no longer in operation were closed. The Delphi staff who participated in the call described how operations were decreased over a period of weeks at each of the sites and that care was completed before closure. After-care arrangements were made. Medical records were mostly in electronic format, with some paper records as well as some legacy paper records. Delphi staff reported that arrangements are being made for archiving the records and pre-payment for required storage period and for making records available to patients. These plans remain under development and finalization. Delphi staff also reported that it maintained departmental personnel to handle medical records through the transition.

A process was set up for arranging site visits with the three locations which continue to be in operation—two in New Jersey and one in Massachusetts. Delphi staff agreed to post the PCO contact information in each of these operating locations.

On February 28, 2023, the PCO participated in a hearing during which the status of the medical records was discussed. The PCO reported that he has been and will continue to be engaged with debtor's counsel as retention of medical records is planned to ensure that they are kept secure and will be accessible to patients for required time periods depending on applicable laws.

Findings

Below is a summary of the monitoring activities of the PCO and his staff during the first reporting period.

March 6, 2023

DBHG operating procedures and protocols were reviewed relating to quality assurance, staff training, environment of care assessments, and 2020 data reports (incidents, client satisfaction surveys, complaints, quality performance). Materials appear to be satisfactory with respect to meeting regulatory standards and management of quality of care. Interviews with Quality Improvement and Compliance personnel indicate no issues with respect to staffing or quality of care issues.

March 8, 2023

Current Open Sites: Inpatient- Serenity at Summit NJ (Union); Outpatient- Summit BH (Princeton Junction); Inpatient-Serenity at Summit New England)

No red flag issues reported with respect to staffing, incidents, purchasing/supplies and quality of care at NJ and NE open facilities.

- Joseph Tomaino, PCO, visited the site on March 29, 2023. Select staff and patients were interviewed to see if the bankruptcy was impacting clinical operations. No issues were identified.
- During this visit, he was informed that the company who anticipated winning the bid for sale of the operations was not selected and therefore withdrew as contracted operator. It was reported to PCO that current Delphi administrators were being redeployed to serve in administrative roles. It was also explained that since the interim administrator had not made any policy or procedure changes, there was no expected disruption.
- Recruitment is underway for two clinical staff positions and a nursing position. Staff at site reported to be welcoming of the management change.

- Florida sites ran notices for four consecutive weeks advising patients of discontinuation of operations and where they can access records.
 - Arete Recovery newspaper run dates: March 5, 2023, March 12, March 19 and March 26.

 - PCO was provided with copy of ads.
- Dr. Rapier will discuss with COO, Linda Earhart, noticing at the closed sites in CA, MD and NJ.

Management Services:

- DBHG decision to select alternative Management Services Organization in March 2023 was due to the company being better funded and positioned for the transition compared to the company named at the bankruptcy filing in January.
- It was reported that many of the original staff are still in place; some of the Medical Records staff went to the management service organization but remain on DBHG's payroll; Admissions staff also under DBHG payroll.
- Some staff will be invited back to work as they have not found other positions.

April 5, 2023

All Open Facilities:

No red flag issues reported with respect to staffing, incidents, purchasing/supplies and quality of care at NJ and NE open facilities.

No coverage gap as newly hired clinician replaced a clinician who resigned on same day.

PCO staff made site visit on March 30, 2023. PCO participated by Zoom and gave presentation of role of PCO. On site PCO staff interviewed select staff and patients to see if the bankruptcy was impacting clinical operations. No issues were identified.

Regulations related to privacy and substance use treatment (42 CFR Part 2) submitted to Operations Chief, Linda Earhart, for inclusion in the medical records contract with Iron Mountain that is in process of being finalized.

Patient Notices/Closed Sites:

As required by Federal Bankruptcy Law, DBHG will run newspaper notices in CA, MD and NJ closed sites advising patients of discontinuation of operations and where they can access records; there had been some confusion about state versus federal requirements.

April 12, 2023

All Open Sites:

No red flag issues reported with respect to personnel, incidents, purchasing/supplies and quality of care at NJ and NE open facilities.

Site Specific:

New Jersey:

Personnel: One night shift position at the IP facility is being recruited
Staff at facility pleased that other MSA is in place.

Patient Census/LOS: 143 patients in March, 58 in April. Length of stay increased from 13.56 to 15.20; less AMAs (reported decrease of 5%). Dr. Rapier noted that with prior MSA, AMAs were at 30%.

New England:

Personnel: Two nursing positions were offered and filled

Patient Census/LOS: 150 patients in March, 58 in April. Length of stay increased from 15.37 to 16.88.

Medical Records:

Medical Records Contract:

Dr. Rapier reported that the medical records contract with Iron Mountain is still being negotiated to assure it is cost effective and optimal for patients. She noted that the contract ultimately could not go to Iron Mountain.

Administration of patient medical records access is proceeding appropriately. By example, Dr. Rapier mentioned a subpoena for records made by an attorney to another party and how communication with the patient on the matter was smoothly handled.

Patient Notices/Closed Sites:

Dr. Rapier reported that the DBHG Board is finalizing which newspapers and locations will be used for patient noticing of the discontinuation of operations/record access at closed sites in CA, MD and NJ.

Complaints

During the meeting with debtor, the PCO provided a PCO contact information sheet which he asked to be posted in each facility still in operation. During each site visit, the posting of this contact information was verified. In addition, a web site was set up by the PCO where patients, staff or interested persons could report an issue for investigation. Since appointment, the PCO has received no calls or emails with patient or employee complaints. No complaints have been voiced when interviewing patients or staff during the site visits as well.

Risk Assessment

This PCO assesses each debtor he is appointed to monitor for level of risk. Based on this level of risk, he plans an appropriate level of monitoring. The PCO assigns the debtor to one of three categories of risk-- low, medium, or high. The level is based on data collected and interviews with management, patients, and staff. This initial determination of level of risk may be adjusted as findings either improve or deteriorate. These three potential levels are outlined below:

- Low-level risk evidenced by transparent reporting, and no observable staffing, supply or quality of care issues that are not readily resolved.
- Mid-level risk evidenced by transparent reporting with some significant observable staffing, supply, or quality issues, or lack of transparent reporting.
- High-level risk evidenced by significant staffing, supply, or quality issues observed, or risk of partial or full closing of services.

Healthcare debtors can move between levels of risk over the course of the bankruptcy, and the risk level will continue to be reassessed with each encounter between the PCO and the facility.

In the case of this debtor, there appears to be no difficulty currently meeting payroll obligations, nor with obtaining supplies, medications, vendor services, etc. There are no reported or observable staffing, medical records, or quality of care issues. The debtor and management have been cooperative, and communication with the PCO appears to be transparent.

The only significant risk of note is the ongoing issues to ensure that medical records of the closed facilities will be available for the required period of time.

Based on the above findings made during this monitoring period, the risk level at this time is determined to be low to medium.

Monitoring Plan

Based on the low-level risk determination, the PCO will implement the following monitoring plan for the next 60-day period:

- On-site tour of the operating facilities and interviews with key staff and residents every four to six weeks.
- Review of quality assurance reports from each facility
- Maintain phone and email hotline posted in each facility and investigate any complaints from patients, families, or staff.
- Monitoring of operating reports and other filings in the case for potential red flags
- Monitor status conferences with attendance periodically as needed or requested by parties.
- Written report to court submitted at the end of the two months.
- Continue to monitor the finalization of procedures to ensure medical record access by patients.

Consistent with requirements outlined in Federal Rule of Bankruptcy Procedure 2015.1-1, notice of this report will be served on each entity that issues licenses or regulates the debtor.

The PCO will make his next report in sixty (60) days or sooner, if circumstances warrant.
