APPELLANTS' STATEMENT OF ISSUES ON APPEAL AND DESIGNATION OF ITEMS TO BE INCLUDED IN THE RECORD ON APPEAL

Appellants the Employee Plaintiffs² (the "<u>Appellants</u>"), by and through their undersigned counsel, and pursuant to Rule 8009(a) of the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure, respectfully

submit the following statement of issues to be presented on appeal and designation of items for inclusion in the record on appeal in connection with Appellants' appeal to the United States District Court for the District of Delaware from the Order and Opinion Denying the Motion to Dismiss or Abstain [D.I. 193, 194], dated May 10, 2023.

I. STATEMENT OF ISSUES TO BE PRESENTED ON APPEAL

This appeal arises out of the Employee Plaintiffs' Motion to Dismiss the Chapter 11 proceeding commenced by Debtor AIG Financial Products Corp. ("AIGFP") pursuant to Bankruptcy Code Sections 1112(b) and 305(a). The Bankruptcy Court held that there was no basis to dismiss AIGFP's Chapter 11 filing, giving rise to this Appeal.

The questions presented are:

- 1. Whether the Bankruptcy Court erred in finding that the financial condition of AIG Inc. was irrelevant to the questions of AIGFP's financial condition and whether AIGFP was in financial distress, when AIG Inc. guaranteed nearly all of AIGFP's financial obligations?
- 2. Whether the Bankruptcy Court erred in finding that AIGFP faced the type and magnitude of "financial distress" required under the Third Circuit's decision in *In re LTL Mgmt.*, *LLC*, 58 F.4th 738, 2023 WL 1098189 (3d Cir. 2023) to sustain a good faith Chapter 11 filing under Section 1112(b)?

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Satanovsky; Mary Heather Singer; Keith Stein; Frank Strohm; Timothy Sullivan Jr.; Chris Toft; Joe Tom; Ryan Vetter; Steven Wagar; Thomas Ward; Martin Wayne; and James Wolf. The Employee Plaintiffs are former AIGFP employees who brought suit in Connecticut Superior Court in 2019 to recover amounts owed to them under AIGFP's deferred compensation plans in the case captioned *Arthurs v. AIG Financial Products Corp.*, Case No. X08-FST-CV-19-6046057-S (Conn. Super. Ct.) (the "Connecticut Litigation"). That case was stayed upon AIGFP's Chapter 11 filing.

- 3. Even assuming that the funding AIG Inc. provided to AIGFP was debt (and it was not)³, could that purported debt cause AIGFP sufficient financial distress to sustain a good faith Chapter 11 filing under Section 1112(b) where, among other things, it had no set interest rate, no payment date or schedule, cash interest was not paid in over a decade, and the purported debt was from AIGFP's parent and sole owner?
- 4. Whether the Bankruptcy Court erred in finding that AIGFP's bankruptcy filing serves a valid reorganizational purpose to sustain a good faith Chapter 11 filing under Section 1112(b) because it preserves value that would be lost outside of bankruptcy, where the record reflects that the estimated costs of the bankruptcy surpass the estimated future costs of the Connecticut Litigation and AIGFP presented no evidence that more value will be realized in bankruptcy than could have been realized outside of bankruptcy?
- 5. Whether the Bankruptcy Court erred in finding that AIGFP's bankruptcy filing serves a valid reorganizational purpose to sustain a good faith Chapter 11 filing under Section 1112(b) where AIGFP has no direct employees, has been winding down for over a decade, and has no business to rehabilitate?
- 6. Whether the Bankruptcy Court erred in finding that "most of the *Primestone* factors are absent in this case" where the Chapter 11 was filed to avoid the production of documents and gain a tactical advantage in the Connecticut Litigation, the purported "debt" was in substance an equity infusion and a pretext to avoid underlying contractual obligations to the Employee Plaintiffs (which are the subject of the Connecticut

- Litigation), AIGFP was meeting its financial obligations to all parties but the Employee Plaintiffs at the time of the filing and there was no pressure from creditors, and the bankruptcy is a two-party dispute between AIGFP and AIG Inc., on the one hand, and the Employee Plaintiffs on the other, among other factors?
- 7. Whether the Bankruptcy Court erred in ruling that AIGFP's Chapter 11 filing should not be dismissed under Section 1112(b)(4)(A) where, *inter alia*, the only non-insider creditors in the bankruptcy case (the Employee Plaintiffs) stated they would not vote in favor of AIGFP's reorganization plan?
- 8. Whether the Bankruptcy Court erred in finding that AIGFP established that its Chapter 11 filing reduced losses by eliminating interest on the funding AIG Inc. provided to AIGFP, where such interest had been capitalized for years prior to the Chapter 11 and there was no set interest rate?
- 9. Whether the Bankruptcy Court erred in finding "a sale under section 363 is a valid bankruptcy avenue" for AIGFP sufficient to satisfy the requirements of Section 1112(b)(4)(A), where AIGFP presented no evidence that an outsider third party is willing to buy AIGFP's assets or otherwise established how it would "toggle" to a 363 sale?
- 10. Whether the Bankruptcy Court erred in finding there was no basis for dismissal under Section 305 where AIGFP will continue to face significant administrative expenses in the Chapter 11 including as a result of the Adversary Proceeding commenced by AIGFP, where the Connecticut Litigation provided an appropriate forum to adjudicate the parties claims and was months away from trial at the time of the Chapter 11 filing, and where any plan proposed by AIGFP is patently unconfirmable without the support

of the Employee Plaintiffs?

- 11. Whether the Bankruptcy Court erred in finding there was "no evidence the Debtor acted improperly pre-petition," including but not limited to, where the evidence reflected that AIGFP took no steps either (i) to prevent AIG Inc. from sweeping approximately \$130 million in cash two days before the bankruptcy filing (and AIGFP's Chief Restructuring Officer was not even aware of the cash management agreement that gave AIGFP an absolute right to those sums) or (ii) to collect an owed \$250 million receivable from AIG affiliates, and where the supposedly independent Special Committee was selected by AIG Inc., abdicated its duties, and deferred to the best interests of AIG Inc.?
- 12. Whether the Bankruptcy Court otherwise erred in finding that AIGFP's bankruptcy filing was filed in good faith?
- 13. Whether the Bankruptcy Court otherwise erred in finding that there was no basis to dismiss AIGFP's bankruptcy filing under section 1112(b)(4)(A)?
- 14. Whether Bankruptcy Court otherwise erred in finding that there was no basis to dismiss AIGFP's bankruptcy filing under Section 305?
- 15. Whether the Bankruptcy Court otherwise erred in denying the Employee Plaintiffs' Motion to Dismiss?
