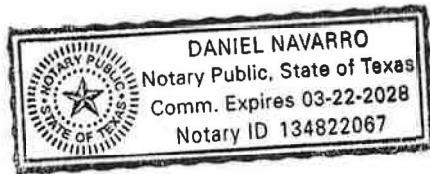



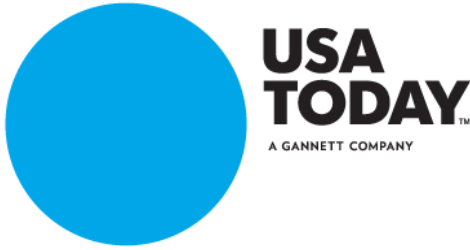

Rory happy with Scottish Open start

Many wondered what Rory McIlroy’s game would look like after taking three weeks off following his nightmare finish at the U.S. Open.

He put those questions to bed Thursday morning.

This week’s defending champion posted an opening-round 5-under 65 at the Genesis Scottish Open and is inside the top 10 after Day 1.

McIlroy’s day began on The Renaissance Club’s 10th hole, where he made a birdie on the par 5. Although he gave it right back on the 11th, McIlroy added birdies on Nos. 14 and 16 to go out with a 1-under 34.

After making the turn, the Northern Irishman got it going.

He hit his approach into the first — his 10th — to less than four feet and converted for birdie. After a par on No. 2,

McIlroy chipped in from off the third green for an eagle to get to 4 under on the day.

He added his fifth circle to the card on No. 4 and would finish his day with five pars — McIlroy missed birdie putts of six feet, eight feet and 11 feet on Nos. 5, 6 and 9, respectively — to solidify his 5-under effort.

“My game has been feeling pretty good in practice over the last ten or so days since I picked the club back up,” he told the media Thursday afternoon. “Obviously, the last time I played, I played well. I didn’t get the result I wanted but I’ve still got a lot of confidence in my game.

“I went time-out there today, shot a solid score. A couple I would have liked to hole coming in and be a few shots lower but overall great start to the tournament.

“Yeah, I sort of picked up where I left off.”

Weeks after turning pro, Lindblad shares major lead

Ingrid Lindblad often made college golf look easy, winning 15 times over the course of five seasons at LSU. She’s doing more of the same in her pro debut on the LPGA at the Amundi Evian Championship.

Lindblad, 24, opened with a bogey-free 7-under 64 to take a share of the first-round lead in her first appearance at the LPGA’s newest major. While Evian celebrates 30 years this week, it’s only been a major since 2013.

“I would say it’s a pretty simple round of golf,” said Lindblad, who shares the early lead with Scotland’s Gemma Dryburgh and Patty Tavatanakit.

After spending 53 weeks as the No. 1 amateur in the world, Lindblad turned professional following the U.S. Women’s Open at Lancaster Country Club in early June. She went directly to the Epson Tour, where she made three consecutive starts, finishing in a share of second at her most recent event.

Then she went home to Sweden for 10 days to see her coaches and rest up for France.

“I think the hardest thing was probably the routine around the events,” said Lindblad of her Epson start. “It’s not the same as a college event or a regular amateur tournament, so just kind of getting used to it.”

Lindblad won the second stage of LPGA Q-School by four strokes in the fall of 2023 but decided to skip the final stage to return to LSU for a fifth season. She turned professional with Epson Tour status but no status on the LPGA of any kind.

This marks Lindblad’s ninth start in an LPGA major, with four appearances in both the U.S. Women’s Open and AIG Women’s British Open. She finished as low amateur at the 2022 U.S. Women’s

Open at Pine Needles, taking a share of 11th after opening with a 6-under 65 that week while playing alongside Annika Sorenstam. It was the lowest round in championship history by an amateur.

“It’s been amazing,” said Lindblad of her first time at the Evian. “Weather is great and that helps a lot. Just I kept saying if you don’t play well, you can just look at the lake and enjoy the views. It’s really pretty and the course is in great condition.”

WIMBLEDON Krejcikova, Paolini set for final

LONDON – Barbora Krejcikova produced a superb comeback to reach her first Wimbledon women’s singles tennis final, showing stubborn resilience in the face of a relentless attacking barrage from former champion Elena Rybakina to triumph 3-6, 6-3, 6-4 on Thursday.

Kazakhstan’s Rybakina had threatened to run away with the contest in the first set, racing to a 5-1 lead with her brand of full-throttle high intensity tennis.

Yet after losing the opener, the 2021 French Open champion dug in and eventually fathomed the puzzle on the other side of the net, breaking in the sixth game of the second set before leveling the contest.

With the momentum having shifted in her favor, the Czech took control in the decider, breaking in the seventh game when Rybakina netted an attempted drop shot.

She brought up three match points with a smash at the net before kicking off the celebrations when Rybakina sent a backhand return long.

Jasmine Paolini survives three-setter

No. 7 seed Jasmine Paolini of Italy advanced to her second consecutive Grand Slam final, defeating Donna Vekic of Croatia 2-6, 6-4, 7-6 (8) Thursday.

It was an emotional 2-hour, 51-minute match that turned into the longest semifinal in the history of women’s singles at Wimbledon and long will be remembered as one of the best.

Either woman could have won, but Paolini outlasted an emotional Vekic in a roller-coaster match and tiebreaker.

As a result, the 28-year-old Italian becomes the first woman since Serena Williams in 2016 to reach the finals of both the French Open and Wimbledon in the same season.

In London on Thursday, Vekic sailed through the first set, striking three aces and winning points on 91% (10 of 11) of her first serves and hitting 12 winners compared to five for Paolini.

And in the second set, the players traded games until the final one, when Paolini broke Vekic’s serve for the first time in the match.

As the match drew longer, the emotions and the nerves seemed to take over. Both players broke serve twice in the third set, and it was two chances that Paolini couldn’t covert that led to the extended 10-point tiebreaker.
