 COMMITTEE OF UNSECURED CREDITORS**

1 I, Leanne M. Williams, hereby declare and state as follows:

2 1. I am a partner with the law firm Thornton Grout Finnigan LLP (the “Firm” or “TGF”),  
 3 which maintains an office in the City of Toronto, Province of Ontario, Canada, and I am authorized to  
 4 make this declaration on behalf of the Firm. The Firm is proposed Canadian counsel for the Official  
 5 Committee of Unsecured Creditors in the above captioned cases (the “Committee”). In such capacity,  
 6 and except as otherwise indicated herein, I have personal knowledge of the facts set forth below, and  
 7 if called as a witness I could and would competently testify to the matters set forth in this declaration.  
 8 I hereby submit this declaration in support of the *Application For an Order Authorizing Retention and*  
 9 *Employment of Thornton Grout Finnigan LLP as Canadian Counsel to the Official Committee of*  
 10 *Unsecured Creditors* (the “Application”) made pursuant to sections 328 and 1103(a) of title 11 of the  
 11 United States Code (“Bankruptcy Code”), Rule 2014(a) of the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure  
 12 (“Federal Bankruptcy Rules”), and Rule 2014 of the Local Bankruptcy Rules for the United States  
 13 Bankruptcy Court for the District of Nevada (the “Local Rules”).

14 2. On June 10, 2024 (the “Petition Date”), each of the Debtors filed voluntary petitions  
 15 for relief under chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code in the United States Bankruptcy Court for the  
 16 District of Nevada (the “Court”), thereby commencing the chapter 11 cases (the “Chapter 11 Cases”).

17 3. The Chapter 11 Cases are jointly administered under case no. 24-50566-HLB and the  
 18 Debtors are operating their businesses and managing their financial affairs as debtors-in-possession  
 19 pursuant to Bankruptcy Code sections 1107 and 1108.

20 4. On June 27, 2024, the Office of the United States Trustee (the “Trustee”) filed its  
 21 *Appointment of Official Committee of Unsecured Creditors* [ECF No. 188].

22 5. The Committee is comprised of five (5) members: (a) Mercuria Holdings (Singapore)  
 23 PTE Ltd.; (b) Small Mine Development, LLC; (c) Boart Longyear Company; (d) Jim Menesini  
 24 Petroleum, LLC; and (e) NewFields Companies, LLC.

25 6. In connection with the Chapter 11 Cases, Nevada Copper, Inc. was appointed to act as  
 26 a foreign representative (in such capacity, the “Foreign Representative”) of the Debtors for relief  
 27 pursuant to Part IV of the *Companies’ Creditors Arrangement Act*, R.S.C. 1985, c. C-36, as amended  
 28 (the “CCAA”).

7. On June 21, 2024, following an application brought by the Foreign Representative before the Ontario Superior Court of Justice (Commercial List) (the “Canadian Court”) bearing Court File number CV-24-00722252-00CL (the “Canadian Proceeding”), the Canadian Court granted an Initial Recognition Order and a Supplemental Order (Foreign Main Proceeding) pursuant to the CCAA.

8. On July 16, 2024 (the “Retention Date”), the Committee selected TGF to serve as its Canadian counsel.<sup>2</sup>

9. TGF’s attorneys are skilled counsel in restructuring, bankruptcy and insolvency cases and have extensive experience in the areas of creditor and debtor matters. TGF has served as Canadian counsel to official committees of unsecured creditors in several significant chapter 11 bankruptcy cases. The Committee accordingly believes that the attorneys at TGF are well-qualified to represent its interests in the CCAA Proceeding undertaken in Canada to recognize these Chapter 11 Cases.<sup>3</sup>

10. Section 1103(a) of the Bankruptcy Code authorizes the Committee to employ counsel to advise and assist in carrying out its duties in a bankruptcy case. The Committee believes that it is in the best interest of the unsecured creditors for the Committee to retain TGF to advise and assist it in connection with all aspects of the Canadian Proceeding of concern to the unsecured creditors and the Committee, including but not limited to the following activities:

- (a) Monitoring the Canadian Proceeding, reporting and providing advice to the Committee with respect to the impact of the Canadian Proceeding upon the Committee’s position in these Chapter 11 Cases;
- (b) Representing the Committee at hearings before the Canadian Court;
- (c) Preparing any material necessary for such hearings or proceedings; and

- (d) Performing such other legal services as may be required or are otherwise deemed to be in the interests of the Committee in accordance with the Committee's powers and duties as set forth in the Bankruptcy Code, Bankruptcy Rules, or other applicable law relating to Canadian law or the Canadian Proceeding.

11. TGF intends to apply for compensation for professional services rendered in connection with these cases subject to the approval of this Court and in compliance with applicable provisions of the Bankruptcy Code and this Court's Guidelines for Compensation and Expense Reimbursement of Professionals and Trustees (the "Compensation Guidelines"), on an hourly basis, plus reimbursement of actual, necessary expenses and other charges incurred by the Firm. The Firm's rates for attorneys and paralegals are as follows:

Partners of the Firm	\$800 – \$1,175
Of Counsel	\$950 – \$1,250
Senior Associates (generally six or more years of experience)	\$750 – \$800
Associates (generally less than six years of experience)	\$500 – \$700

12. The hourly rates set forth above in Canadian Dollars are subject to annual adjustments, usually on January 1st of each year, to reflect economic and other conditions. TGF will advise the Debtors, the Committee and the Trustee of any increases in its hourly rates.

13. The hourly rates set forth above are the Firm's normal hourly rates for work of this type. These rates are set at a level designed to fairly compensate the Firm for the work of its attorneys and paralegals and to cover fixed and routine overhead expenses. TGF will not charge for non-working travel time. There will be no limitation on TGF's right to seek reimbursement of all other out-of-pocket disbursements and expenses incurred in connection with the Chapter 11 Cases. These expenses charged to clients include, among other things, charges for messenger services, overnight delivery services, photocopying, court fees, travel expenses, working meals, postage, materials for large mailings, computerized legal research facilities, computerized document inventory

1 and control, investigative searches, and other charges customarily invoiced by law firms in addition  
2 to fees for legal services. The Firm will charge the Committee for these expenses in a manner and at  
3 rates consistent with charges made generally to the Firm's other clients and in accordance with the  
4 Compensation Guidelines.

5 14. As of the date of this Declaration, TGF has not received a retainer with respect to its  
6 representation of the Committee, and there is no retainer agreement between the Committee and TGF.  
7 It is intended that the Application and the Court's order approving TGF's retention will govern TGF's  
8 employment in these cases, with the Court retaining jurisdiction to resolve any issue that might arise.

9 15. In conformity with Bankruptcy Code sections 330 and 331, TGF intends to file interim  
10 applications for allowance of fees and reimbursement of costs advanced as and when appropriate under  
11 the Bankruptcy Rules, the Local Rules and this Court's orders.

12 16. At the conclusion of these cases, TGF will file an appropriate application seeking final  
13 allowance of all fees and costs, regardless of whether interim compensation has been paid. Upon  
14 allowance of such fees and costs, the Debtors will cause to be paid to TGF the difference between the  
15 amounts allowed and any interim compensation paid.

16 17. TGF has not shared, or agreed to share, any compensation related to the services to be  
17 rendered as Canadian counsel for the Committee with any other person, except as among TGF firm  
18 members and/or employees and counsel.

19 18. TGF maintains a computerized database of its client matters. In connection with the  
20 proposed retention of TGF by the Committee, TGF performed an internal conflicts search to ensure  
21 that the Firm does not have a conflict of interest that would prohibit it from representing the Committee  
22 in this matter. Specifically, TGF obtained from Lowenstein Sandler LLP the names of individuals and  
23 entities that may be parties in interest in the Chapter 11 Cases and such parties are listed on **Schedule 1**  
24 attached hereto (the "**Potential Party List**"). TGF has searched its electronic database for its  
25 connections to the entities listed on the Potential Party List.

26 19. Attached hereto as **Schedule 2** is a list of parties that TGF may currently represent or  
27 may have represented in the past on matters wholly unrelated to the Chapter 11 Cases, and  
28 professionals with whom TGF may have served as co-counsel, including parties who appear on the

1 Potential Party List.

2 20. Except as disclosed herein or on Schedule 2 attached hereto, neither I, TGF, nor any  
3 member, counsel, or associate thereof, insofar as I have been able to ascertain, have any connection  
4 with the Debtors, their creditors, or any other parties in interest, their respective attorneys and  
5 accountants, the Office of the United States Trustee (the “US Trustee”), any person employed in the  
6 Office of the United States Trustee, or any Bankruptcy Judge currently serving on the United States  
7 Bankruptcy Court for the District of Nevada.

8 21. To the best of my knowledge, information and belief, and other than the connections  
9 described in Schedule 2, TGF has no interest materially adverse to (a) the interest of the Debtors’  
10 estates, (b) the Committee, or (c) any class of the Debtors’ creditors, either by reason of any direct or  
11 indirect relationship to, or connection with, the Debtors or for any other reason.

12 22. I believe that TGF is a disinterested person within the meaning of Bankruptcy Code  
13 section 101(14).

14 23. Finally, to the best of my knowledge, no grounds exist that would make employment  
15 of TGF or any of its attorneys improper under Rule 5002(a) of the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy  
16 Procedure.

17 24. As TGF becomes aware of new parties-in-interest becoming involved in these cases,  
18 TGF will file supplemental declarations as needed to update the disclosures made herein.

19 25. Except to the extent the Court allows payment of compensation to the Firm out of the  
20 assets of the estates, the Firm has no compensation arrangements with the Debtors or any entity related  
21 to the Debtors, the Committee, or any other individual or entity associated with the Chapter 11 Cases.

#### 22 **STATEMENT REGARDING U.S. TRUSTEE GUIDELINES**

23 26. As this Court is aware, the Executive Office for United States Trustees (“EOUST”)  
24 recently adopted the new *Guidelines for Reviewing Applications for Compensation and*  
25 *Reimbursement of Expenses Filed under 11 U.S.C. § 330 by Attorneys in Larger Chapter 11 Cases*  
26 (the “Appendix B Guidelines”). By their terms, the Appendix B Guidelines “apply to the USTP’s  
27 review of applications for compensation filed by attorneys in larger chapter 11 cases,” and are intended  
28 as an update to the original Guidelines (the “Appendix A Guidelines”) adopted by the EOUST in 1996.

1 The Appendix A Guidelines have been a part of this Court's local procedures for years. In other  
2 chapter 11 cases where it has been retained, TGF has filed its fee applications in compliance with the  
3 Appendix A Guidelines.

4 27. Among other things, the Appendix B Guidelines ask attorneys in larger chapter 11  
5 cases to provide additional documentation and make significant new disclosures in connection with  
6 their retention under section 327 and compensation under section 330 of the Bankruptcy Code. As  
7 the Appendix B Guidelines themselves acknowledge, "the Guidelines do not supersede local rules,  
8 court orders, or other controlling authority," and it remains to be seen how the Appendix B Guidelines  
9 will be incorporated into larger chapter 11 cases.

10 28. TGF intends to make a reasonable effort to comply with the U.S. Trustee's requests for  
11 information and additional disclosures as set forth in the Appendix B Guidelines both in connection  
12 with this Application and the interim and final fee applications to be filed by TGF in the course of its  
13 engagement. It is TGF's intention to work cooperatively with the U.S. Trustee to address the concerns  
14 that prompted the EOUST to adopt the Appendix B Guidelines; however, in doing so, TGF reserves  
15 all rights as to the relevance and substantive legal effect of the Appendix B Guidelines in respect of  
16 any application for employment or compensation in these Chapter 11 Cases that falls within the ambit  
17 of the Appendix B Guidelines.

18 **ATTORNEY STATEMENT PURSUANT TO APPENDIX B GUIDELINES**

19 29. The following is provided in response to the request for additional information set forth  
20 in Paragraph D.1. of the Appendix B Guidelines.

21 Question: Did you agree to any variations from, or alternatives to, your standard  
22 or customary billing arrangements for this engagement?

23 Response: No.

24 Question: Do any of the professionals included in this engagement vary their rate  
25 based on the geographic location of the bankruptcy case?

26 Response: No.

27 Question: If you represented the client in the 12 months prepetition, disclose your  
28 billing rates and material financial terms for the prepetition engagement, including any adjustments

1 during the 12 months prepetition. If your billing rates and material financial terms have changed post-  
2 petition, explain the difference and the reasons for the difference.

3 Response: N/A.

4 Question: Has your client approved your prospective budget and staffing plan,  
5 and, if so for what budget period?

6 Response: The Committee will be approving a prospective budget and staffing plan  
7 for TGF's engagement as appropriate. In accordance with the 2013 UST Guidelines, the budget may  
8 be amended as necessary to reflect changed or unanticipated developments. The Committee has  
9 approved TGF's proposed hourly billing rates and the Debtors' DIP financing budget.

10 30. Notice of this Application has been given to the United States Trustee, counsel for the  
11 Debtors, and those parties who have filed requests for special notice. I submit that no further notice  
12 need be given.

13 31. The foregoing constitutes the statement of the Firm pursuant to Sections 1103 and  
14 504 of the Bankruptcy Code and Rule 2014(a) of the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure.

15 I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.
